At eight years old and about 13 lbs., I'm just the right size to sit in your lap while you snuggle with me to your heart's content. When someone applies to become a Havanese Rescue Inc volunteer, a Volunteer Coordinator (VC) processes the application, or assigns the processing to an assistant application processor. Processing includes reference checks, a home evaluation (if fostering is planned), and submission of the applicant's paperwork for review by a volunteer approval committee.

The VC and processing assistants maintain all applicant records and signed contracts.

Once the applicant information is reviewed and approved by the Volunteer Approval Committee, the new volunteer is added to the HRI roster and welcoming information is provided. The VC and assistants are also available to answer questions from the new volunteers about fostering, joining and communicating via the HRI Yahoo Groups, using the HRI website, etc.

In addition to "regular" volunteer applicants, there are foster-to-adopt (FA) applicants, who become temporary volunteers until they adopt. These applications are handled by a Foster-to-Adopt Coordinator who is also part of the Volunteer Approval Committee.
