2010 By The Numbers -- 2011 Annual Appeal

Sometimes we forget that rescue is not simply a matter of taking dogs and finding a new place for them to live. 162 dogs were taken into rescue during 2010. 140 of those have now found permanent homes.

Adoption Corner

Each dog received at least a veterinary check-up (vaccines, heartworm, etc.).

- 27 were neutered
- 26 were spayed
- 7 received eye surgeries (cataract, cherry eye repairs)
- 45 dental procedures (cleanings, extractions, etc.) were performed

- Junie: removal of mammary tumors, spay, cherry eye repair, dental. (\$2,796.80)

Total spent on the dogs: \$118,706.45

Who We Are -- State Contacts

Havanese Rescue has a designated volunteer for each state, the State Contact, who is responsible for identifying dogs who come into rescue in their state, finding an available foster home for them, arranging transport and keeping in weekly touch with the foster families. When a foster dog is ready for adoption, our State Contact steps in once again to provide applications from potential families that are appropriate for this particular dog. The State Contact, the foster family and the HRI adoption

In addition, State Contacts receive volunteer and adoption applications for review and communicate with the applicants. The State Contact checks applicant references and arranges home visits for adoption preparation or for new foster volunteers becoming part of the HRI family.

Sadly, that path was not open to Katie. Her heart problems went well beyond a mere hole, which sounds simple, doesn't it? She was in a lifethreatening situation from the day she was born. There was no treatment, surgery or miracle that could have kept Katie with us.

With heavy hearts we agreed that the best and kindest route for Katie was to send her over the Rainbow Bridge. She left her pain and suffering behind -- we carry it for her now.

It was an honor and privilege for me to take care of Katie. Her last days were filled with everything a dog's life should be about -- love, kindness, safety and belly rubs.
